What is the Multidimensional Poverty Peer Network?



- Our aim is to provide support (moral, technical, collegial among peers) to policymakers who are developing or implementing a Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) and using it to shape policy \mathcal{O} and accelerate poverty reduction.
 - Launched in the run-up to the SDGs in June 2013 at Univ of Oxford with: Then-President Santos of Colombia S S S Ministers and Vice-Ministers Sharing experience
 - A lecture from Professor Amartya Sen

By 2015, Multidimensional Poverty reported against SDG 1.2.2:

- SDG Target 1.2 & Indicator 1.2.2: "*By 2030, reduce at least by half the proportion of men, women, and children living in poverty in all its dimensions <u>according to national definitions</u>."*
- ***** 84 countries report 1.2.2 (+ rapidly expanding)

(July 2024)

- 43 countries and 2.97 billion people have a National MPI
 - Disaggregated into 7,222 subnational regions + by age, rural/urban, disability etc
- ✤ 34 countries and 577 million people use Eurostat's AROPE
- 2 countries (Burundi, Tonga) use Non-MPI, Non-AROPE methodologies.
- **5** additional countries have an individual child MPI but no official national MPI.
- Global MPI is available for 110 countries 6.1 billion in 2023 (launch 17 Oct will have 112 C; 6.3B)
