OPHI Workshop on Robustness Methods for Multidimensional Welfare Analysis Queen Elizabeth House, 5-6 May 2009

This workshop brought together 25 junior and senior researchers, including Professors Tony Atkinson, Gordon Anderson, Jean-Yves Duclos, James Foster, Stephen Jenkins, Lars Osberg, Andrea Saltelli, Alain Trannoy, and others working on robustness and dominance techniques to analyse the conditions under which multidimensional welfare or poverty indicators rank social groups consistently, and the degree of sensitivity of these indicators to changes in their key components; such as the weights attached to dimensions or the criteria used to identify a particular subgroup of the population like the poor.
